Principal

Hello everyone and welcome back to Term 4. I can't believe how quickly this year is going. Christmas is just around the corner!

This term we have some important staffing changes to announce. Mr Brad Hughes (Head Teacher PD/H/PE) was successful at interview and has been appointed Deputy Principal of Warrawong High School. He is currently seconded to work as Relieving Student Services Consultant. The school hopes to have the position of Head Teacher filled by start of Term 1 2013. Ms Potter is currently Relieving Head Teacher PD/H/PE and Mr Phillips will relieve during the second part of the term. On behalf of our school I would like to wish Mr Hughes well in his new role and thank him for his fantastic contributions to our school as Head Teacher and Relieving Deputy Principal. We are also in the process of interviewing teachers for a science teacher position at our school. I will be able to announce the successful candidate in the next newsletter.

Our 2012 timetable is well under way to creation using a new timetabling program that allows better student matches and allows a more student driven curriculum. It is anticipated we will have five year 7 classes in 2013, however, we are still getting approached by new families applying to enrol in our school next year which is a pleasing indication of the school's growing reputation in the community.

In Week 7 of Term 3 our school received the exciting news that we will receive Transitional Equity Funding in 2013. The funding and 2.4 staffing allocation will be used to implement innovative literacy, numeracy and engagement strategies for our students. The specific details were outlined to staff at the last staff meeting.

We are also making great efforts to improve the grounds and buildings of Illawarra Sports High School. A major creek restoration project is underway involving clearing of noxious weeds and rejuvenation/planting of natives. Work will continue for the rest of this year and start of 2013. Plans are also underway for a new front entrance to our school. This will be a great improvement to the physical appearance of the school. Sign over and use of the new trade training facility is also planned for this term. The Industrial Arts Department are very happy with the quality of the new building which allows industry standard metals and engineering training for students.

As usual I am very proud to mention some of the many achievements of our students. Late last term I had the pleasure of attending the In2Uni Showcase at Wollongong University. Groups of Illawarra Sports High School students have been working with university mentors on a range of projects including

- creation of a water filter for disadvantaged communities
- · creating and marketing a global corporation
- · creating a TV news broadcast

Individual students who attended the showcase were asked to paint an image that represented them on a paving tile. These tiles will be laid to make a pathway at the university, thereby leaving a lasting memory of the students' experience of university life. My sincere hope is that many of the students who participated in the program will go on to study at Wollongong University when they complete the HSC at Illawarra Sports High. I am sure they will one day walk along the pathway and remember their time as students of Illawarra Sports High. Some pictures of the students who attended the showcase and the "memory tiles' have been included in this newsletter.

The project consisted of a Probability Machine that calculates distribution and indicates the results using a curve. For the full article in the Illawarra Mercury, go to story





Our school has recently welcomed many students that have come to Australia as refugees. These students have come from very challenging situations in their home countries. Apart from doing our best to welcome these new students to our school, we would like to provide some support to some of the people from these students' villages who have not been fortunate enough to have found safe refuge in Australia.

In our first major project we have decided to try to help the families and young people from Liberia. We have been advised by our new students that one of the most useful things we could do is provide 'school packs' (paper, pencils, pens etc.) to support the children with their school education. Attending school in Liberia can be very expensive for families, and many students will not have access to school because their families cannot afford the costs associated with attending. We thought that developing 'school packs' for children in Liberia could be an achievable goal for us to work towards.


